MEMBERSHIP INFORMATION

Meetings are held in the Toorak Uniting Church Hall, 603 Toorak Road Toorak. (Melway Map 2M K7 & 58 K4), usually on the first Friday of the month between February and December at 8.00pm.

Programs include plant commentaries, local and interstate speakers.

- Topics are varied with emphasis on cultivation techniques.
- Members display a large variety of cultivated plants on a non-competitive basis.
- Members provide a plant sales table at monthly meetings.
- Plant identification and problem solving service available at meetings.
- A comprehensive library for members' use.

The *Bulletin*, our monthly newsletter, is mailed to members and contains useful advice and informative articles written by members of our Society. Our members have the option of receiving a black and white mailed *Bulletin* (\$24 within Australia or \$34 overseas) or a full-colour Electronic *Bulletin* (\$18 worldwide).

New Members are welcome to participate in any of the various group activities organised by the society.

The **Epiphyte Study Group** and the **Terrestrial Study Group** meet regularly to study epiphytic and terrestrial orchids in detail.

The **Conservation Group** meets informally to discuss the preservation of native orchids in their natural habitat.

The **Tuber Bank**, operated by mail, distributes dormant terrestrial orchid tubers at minimal cost.

Social activities include field trips, shadehouse and glasshouse visits, and weekends away.

The **Annual Spring Show** - Melbourne's finest display of native orchids.

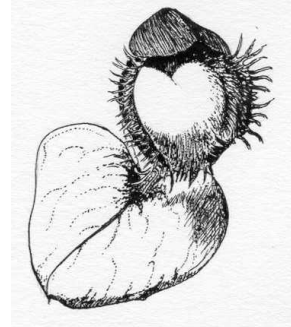

The Victorian group of this national body was formed in 1968 to serve the special interests of Victorians. Members of the Victorian group meet monthly in a friendly informal atmosphere, and you are invited to join and share with other members the fascinating world of Australasian native orchids.

Australia has over 1000 species of native orchids and their habitat is being destroyed at an alarming rate. The Society is dedicated to the conservation of our orchids through cultivation and propagation and also by discouraging the destruction of their habitat and the illegal collection of wild plants.
